We are his people and the sheep of his pasture.

Praise his name, for the Lord is sweet; his mercy is forever, and his truth from generation to generation.

OLD TESTAMENT CANTICLE (ISAIAH 49:7–13)

Thus says the Lord, the Redeemer of Israel, his Holy One, to the contemptible soul, to the abhorred nation, to the servant of rulers.

"Kings will see, and princes will rise up and adore, for the sake of the Lord, because he is faithful, and the Holy One of Israel who has chosen you."

Thus says the Lord: "In an acceptable time I have heard you, and in the day of salvation I have helped you."

"And I have kept you and given you to be a covenant of the people, that you might raise up the earth, and possess the inherited wastes."

"That you might say to those that are bound: 'Come forth.' And to those that are in darkness: 'Show yourselves.'"

"They will feed in the ways, and their pastures will be in every plain."

"They will not hunger, nor thirst, neither will the heat nor the sun strike them."

"For he that is merciful to them will be their shepherd, and at the fountains of waters he will give them drink."

"And I will make all my mountains a way, and my paths will be exalted."

"Behold, these will come from far, and behold, those will come from the north and from the sea, and others from the south land."

Give praise, O you heavens, and rejoice, O earth; give praise, O you mountains, in jubilation, because the Lord has comforted his people and will have mercy on his poor ones.

GOSPEL CANTICLE: BENEDICTUS (LUKE 1:68-79)

THE CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH (BENEDICTUS) (LUKE 1:68-79)

Ant. This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. Alleluia.

Blessed is the Lord, the God of Israel, because he has visited and accomplished the redemption of his people.

And he has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of David his servant.

As he spoke through the mouth of his holy prophets, those who have been from the beginning:

Salvation from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us.

To show mercy to our fathers and to remember his holy covenant,

the oath which he swore to our father Abraham, that he would grant to us,

that being freed from the hand of our enemies, we might serve him without fear,

in holiness and justice before him, throughout all our days.

And you, child, will be called a prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the face of the Lord, to prepare his ways.

To give knowledge of salvation to his people, for the remission of their sins,

through the compassionate mercy of our God, by which the Rising Sun has visited us from on high,

to illuminate those sitting in darkness and in the shadow of death, to direct our feet in the way of peace.

MORNING INTERCESSIONS

For all nations, that the peace of the risen Christ may overcome division and bring reconciliation: we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear us. Alleluia.*

For ourselves, that we may live as Easter people, bringing the good news of new life to those around us: we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, hear us. Alleluia.*

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Let us pray as the Lord himself has taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come,
thy will be done
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread,
and forgive us our trespasses
as we forgive those who trespass against us;
and lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory,
forever and ever. Amen.
