Lines of Apostolic Succession

The Apostolic Succession of Bishop Williams flows through three consecrating bishops, all of whose orders derive from the same root streams. Archbishop Andre Leon Zotique Barbeau served as chief consecrator; Archbishop Michael Nee J. Boucher and Archbishop Andre Letellier served as co-consecrators. All three received their episcopal orders ultimately through Archbishop Charles Brearley (Ignatius Carolus) of Yorkshire, Old Catholic, who himself carried both the Old Catholic Utrecht line and the Anglican/Episcopal line through Mar Georgius and the Vilatte/Antioch line. Cardinal Edouard Gagnon, P.S.S., confirmed in writing on May 6, 2002 that Bishop Letellier's orders through Archbishop Barbeau and Archbishop Barbeau's orders through Archbishop Brearley were validly received.

Old Catholic Succession through Utrecht [Line 1]

Via Archbishop Andre Leon Zotique Barbeau, Chief Consecrator. This line runs from St. Peter through the Roman Pontiffs, then branches at Cardinal Antonio Barberini to the Old Catholic Church of Utrecht, through the British Old Catholic succession, and finally to Archbishop Barbeau.

Via Archbishop Andre Letellier, Co-Consecrator. Archbishop Letellier received his own episcopal orders from Archbishop Barbeau on May 24, 1968, thus carrying the same Utrecht succession documented in Line 1. His participation in the consecration of Bishop Williams constitutes a second, independent transmission of the same orders.
