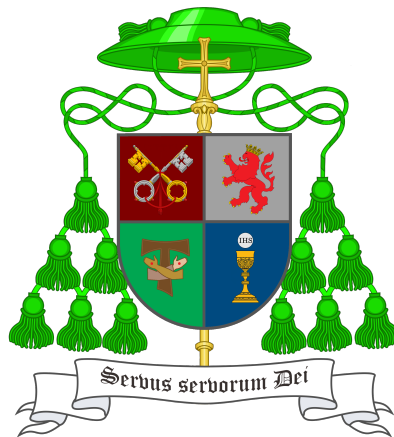

Bishop Godsey was originally consecrated on June 21, 1999 by Bishop D. Ford and Bishop S. Hoover.

Documentation of their lines of succession was not provided and could not be located.

The subconditional consecration of March 30, 2004 resolved all questions of validity.
